4) The Fire Chief may authorize a additional fee of \$50.00 per hour for inspections or re-inspections that are requested or required after hours.

5) Permit is good for one open burn, not to exceed 24 hours. Permit also includes up to two alternate dates.

6) Rates based on the Hazardous Materials Response Billing Protocol for Iowa Fire Departments, 2002 edition & the FEMA Schedule Reimbursement Rates, 2010 edition. Minimum of one hour. Billed in 15-minute increments beyond the first hour.
